Director, Sugarcane Research Institute, Pusa, Dr. S.S. Pandey alongwith Scientists of institute Dr. S.K. Thakur, Dr. D.N. Kamat and Dr. Minnatullah visited the farmers field demonstration plots at Harinagar Sugar Factory area on 19.07.2018 under the programme doubling of farmers income through sugarcane based intercropping system. The farmers of factory areas prefer mostly potato with sugarcane based cropping system. Under this intercropping system yield of both the component crops are similar to that recorded sole crop.



College of Fisheries, Dholi, demonstrated raising of genetically improved variety of rohu (Jayanti rohu), developed by ICAR-Central Institute of Freshwater Aquaculture, Bubaneswar in the grow-out pond. The demonstration was undertaken in the pond of College fish farm. After pre-stocking preparation of growout pond, the Jayanti rohu fingerlings of average weight 125-150 gm were stoked. The Jayanti fingerlings were reared for three months from 15th April 2018 to 15th July 2018 with appropriate post stocking management practice including manuring and supplementary feeding. After three months, the growth of Jayanti rohu was found to be of about one kilogram, which is better growth compared to the performance of local Rohu. This improved Rohu showed very high potential to increase the aguaculture productivity.



NEWS FROM KVKS

KVK Saraiya conducted 50 training program under Krishi Kalyan Abhiyan programme in the month of July in 25 different aspirational villages of Muzaffarpur district. Trainings were conducted on the topic of Mushroom cultivation, beekeeping, kitchen gardening and vermi- compost production. Total numbers of participants were 2732. Two days training programme from 26-27th July 2018 for extension functionaries (Agriculture coordinator and Kisan Salahkar) was also organized on the topic of "Importance and use of waste decomposer and construction of NADEP compost unit". The total numbers of participants were 36.





KVK Saraiya conducted residential training programme of seven days from 16^{th} - 22^{nd} July 2018 on the topic of Honeybee production. Total number of participants was 27 from different aspiration villages of Muzaffarpur. This programme was sponsored by National bee board, Barabanki. Total number of participants was 29.
