From the Vice-Chancellor Desk

Welcome to the July edition of e-Newsletter of Dr. Rajendra Prasad Central Agricultural University.

July is the critical monsoon month for Indian agriculture as the Kharif crop season begins from July. The term 'Kharif' is an Arabic word for autumn. Kharif crops are also known as monsoon crops. Sowing of major crops of this season like Rice, Maize, Bajra, Ragi, Soyabean, Groundnut and Cotton have started and we hope a better production this year.

Torrential rain in the 'terai' region of Nepal and adjoining areas along the foothill of the Himalayas caused floods in 12 districts of North Bihar including Samastipur where the University is situated. My team kept 24 hours surveillance on Budhi Gandak River as the University is surrounded from three sides by this river. Water Management for both flood and draught has emerged as an important issue. During my interview for Doordarshan I emphasized this and also narrated the success story of our University in flood management, efficient irrigation and ground water recharge. There was no water logging during heavy rains in the University because of the ground water recharge system we have initiated.

Another feather in the cap of the University is success of our students. 12 students cleared ICAR PG entrance exam, where as one student Aditya Pritam got first rank in the entrance exam of FRI, Dehradun. One student Subhasish Ranjan got admission in IIT Kharagpur. On placement front 90 percent MBA students got placed. Students of Fisheries had 100 percent success rate with 50 percent going for higher studies in reputed institutions. I congratulate all the students for their success and wish them success and prosperity to follow wherever they go. University is buzzing with different activities; you will find news in brief about these in the Newsletter.






VICE-CHANCELLOR'S ENGAGEMENT
